SYMPTOMS

Only about 20% of cases are diagnosed in the early stages (Stages I-II), since symptoms often don't appear until the disease is in more advanced stages (stages III-IV).

- BloatingTrouble eating or feeling full quickly Pelvic/abdominal pain
- Urinary frequency Fatigue
- Menstrual changes
- Back pain
- · Upset stomach, heartburn, or constipation



RISK FACTORS

Certain factors can increase your risk of developing ovarian cancer.



- Being a woman
- Overweight or obese Childbirth later in life or never having a full-term
- Hormone replacement therapy
 Family history of ovarian cancer, breast cancer, or colorectal cancer
 - Personal history of breast cancer
- Fertility treatmentSmoking





TREATMENT

Treatment can include a combination of surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation.





Integrative medicine such as massage, acupuncture, and yoga can help as well
